State Energy Sector Partnership Training Grant

Earn a Certificate in Advanced Energy Storage or Renewable Energy

Michigan has become the new center of the world's electric vehicle and advanced battery industries. Michigan is also beginning to make the switch to renewable energy to remain economically viable and protect our environment.

The SESP Grant funds all tuition cost for qualified unemployed adults to teach them the skills required to help gain employment as an electrical equipment installer (medium wage \$30,000), engineering technician (\$50,000) or electrical engineer (\$80,000).

All courses must be completed by the end of 2012 to be paid for by the grant.

The following colleges are offering programs funded by the SESP Grant:

Wayne State University Graduate and Undergraduate Certificate

WSU is offering a Graduate Certificate in Alternative Energy Tech or Electric-Drive Vehicle Engineering with a concentration in Advanced Energy Storage (AES). This is a 3 course 12 credit program requiring a Bachelor in Engineering and a 2.8 GPA.

WSU is also offering an Undergraduate Certificate in AES. This is a 4 course 12 credit program requiring at least 30 credit hours in math, science or other technical courses.

Macomb Community College Advanced Energy Storage Certificate Program

Earn this certificate in just 2 – 4 months of intensive training. This 2 course program is ideal for aspiring technicians or experienced professionals looking to upgrade their skills. It requires at least some college or vocational training, strong math skills and preferably some work experience in a related field.

Henry Ford Community College Basic Renewable Energy Certificate Program

Learn about solar, wind, fuel cell and geothermal power in one of the region's top renewable energy programs. This is a 5 course, 10 credit program requiring a High School Degree or GED. All courses must be completed by the end of 2012.
